## WHAT IS SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

**Spiritual Direction** provides a companion and guide for the journey of spiritual growth. It is the goal of the Spiritual Director to help a person develop a closer relationship with God and to discern the invitations of the Holy Spirit.

### SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

Assists in de-mystifying prayer, making it a practical part of everyday life;

Helps you to see and face the truth about yourself without rationalization;

Provides help and non-judgmental support for the rough spots in a Christian life; and

Gives clarification on aspects of religious doctrine as it applies to daily life.

### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN A SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

Key qualities are compatibility and a listening ear. Find someone you are comfortable with and can trust.

### WHAT HAPPENS IN SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

Spiritual direction is really not about being “directed.” Rather, it is very much about being encouraged to draw closer to God. In spiritual direction, you reflect deeply on the experiences of your daily life. Gradually, as you contemplate, you may begin to recognize God’s presence and grace in your life. The director is a reverent listener offering questions and guidance as your spiritual journey unfolds. A session may include spoken and/or silent prayer, contemplative exercises, or Scripture reading.

## HOW TO PREPARE FOR A SESSION

Prior to your spiritual direction session you might spend some time reflecting upon and maybe journaling your response to these question:

1. What has been the general spiritual tone of your life?
2. What events, experiences, relationships, etc. have communicated to you a sense of God’s presence?
3. What events, experiences, relationships, etc. have communicated to you a sense of God’s absence?
4. Describe your manner of prayer. How well does your prayer help you to experience conscious contact with God?
5. What kinds of decisions in your life have you searching for a sense of God’s will?
6. In what area of life do you sense God calling you to growth?
7. What kind of feedback would you like from your spiritual director?
